Safeguarding Statement of the Lincoln Diocese

The Diocese of Lincoln is committed to ensuring that the very best practice in relation to safeguarding is delivered across the diocese, from the response of the local parish-based volunteer to the Bishop himself. There is no excuse for anyone within the Church not to take very seriously their duties in respect of promoting the welfare and protection of anyone, child or adult, who is vulnerable.

What is the role of the Parochial Church Council (PCC)?

- PCC is required to sign up to Safeguarding Principles every three years (Copy of signed Principles on noticeboard in this church).
- The PCC has the legal responsibility to adopt, implement and monitor the safeguarding policies.
- The guidance suggests that the PCC appoint a parish safeguarding officer to assist them.

The Diocesan Safeguarding Team

- The safeguarding team's job is to offer advice and support regarding the safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults to those who are working with or for the Church of England in the Diocese of Lincoln whether they are members of the Clergy, Church Officers or PCC members, volunteers or paid staff.
- The team also supports people who make contact with the Church because they have been affected by abuse in their own lives and can arrange for specialist support and advice where this is necessary.
